Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Running out of money for food? Let MU Extension Family Nutrition Education Program assist you with the application process to apply for SNAP benefits. SNAP is the largest federal nutrition assistance program providing benefits to eligible low-income individuals and families via an Electronic Benefits Transfer card. This card can be used like a debit card to purchase eligible food in authorized retail food stores.

Who is eligible for this program? To be eligible for this benefit program, applicants must live in the state in which they apply and meet certain bank balance limits. A household with an elderly (over 60) or disabled



When Snow is in the Forecast

During a snow storm, city crews will treat the streets with sand and salt. They will normally begin around 6:00 am on the morning of or the morning after the storm. The major streets of Main, Mason, Dryden, Johnson, Phillips, First, Third, North Fourth, South Fifth and South Ninth streets will be treated and plowed first. Other streets will be done as quickly as possible depending on the conditions. Please avoid parking vehicles on streets when snow is forecasted.

It is also important for business owners and residents keep the sidewalks in front of their properties cleared of snow and ice. Owners of vacant properties need to make sure those sidewalks are cleared as well. Please ensure there is a clear path for pedestrians and wheelchairs to travel safely.

Lafayette County Hazardous Waste Drop

Lafayette County has a household hazardous waste drop off program in place in Concordia and Lexington and is free to residents of Lafayette County. **Drop offs are by appointment only**. Collection site operation dates and times vary. Schedule an appointment in Concordia by calling 660-463-2228. The drop off days are every Thursday from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Schedule an appointment in Lexington by calling 660-232-3827. Drop off days are the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month.
